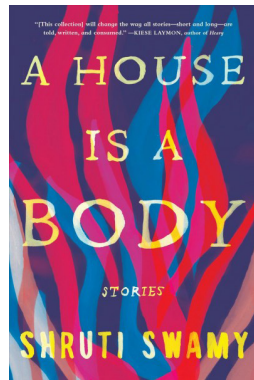

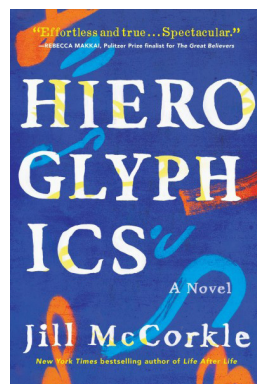
❑ **A House is a Body by Shruti Swamy**

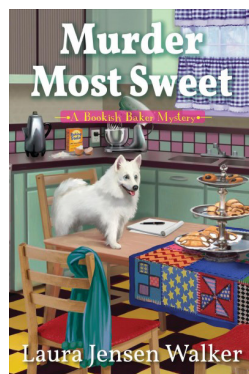
❑ **Hieroglyphics by Jill McCorkle**

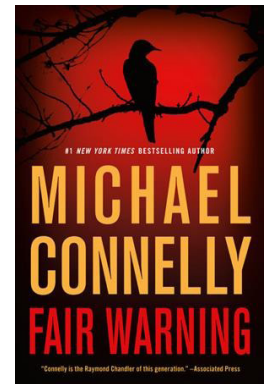
❑ **Murder Most Sweet by Laura Jensen Walker**

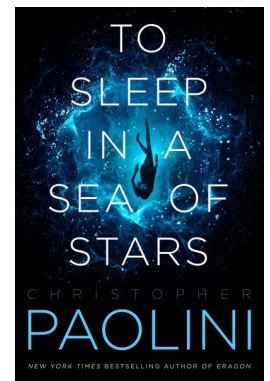
❑ **Fair Warning by Michael Connelly**

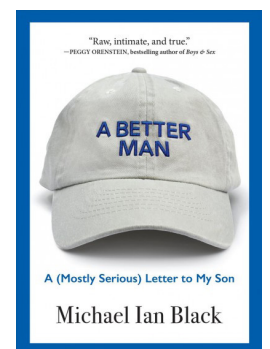
❑ **To Sleep in a Sea of Stars by Christopher Paolini**
